## **From the Rector**

### **Small things make a difference**

It was only an interview lasting two or three minutes on the radio, but I felt I learnt more from this short interview than I would have done spending a day watching the news. A doctor working on a Covid ward was briefly sharing his experiences.

He brought the reality and uncertainty of our situation into sharp focus. He explained that he did not have any medical cures to offer on the wards — their focus was only on alleviating the consequences of the virus using oxygen, antibiotics and so on. He then explained that the virus could still mutate and we don't know what the consequences would be.

But it was what he said next that particularly stuck me. Having acknowledged his medical limitations, he said he focussed on those things that he could do. He tried to speak with compassion to all the patients, many of whom were not able to speak themselves, and who could not have loved ones visit.

He held patients' hands. He arranged for a husband and wife to have their beds together. Listening to him I felt I had gained a much deeper understanding of what it was like working on a Covid ward. It was these small acts of kindness that struck me. We may feel powerless at the moment, but we always have the power to show kindness to those around us.

Some tired doctors and nurses on a ward overcame the hassle of moving beds and equipment so that a married couple could be together. Little did they know that this would make me (and maybe you) wonder what I could do for someone today?

# Alpheton Village Hall




As everyone will understand, the Village Hall Committee has been unable to meet due to the current situation and the planned AGM on April 28 had to be postponed.

However the four committee members are meeting virtually and hope to soon be able to provide more of an update to everyone on possible reopening for socially distanced events such as Film Night.

Our thanks to Gordon and Stephen (committee members) in their successful application to Babergh & Mid Suffolk District Councils Small Business Support fund for a grant of £10,000 for much needed improvement works to the village hall.

There is an intention to consider applications for other grants that may be available, but in the meantime the most pressing issue would seem to be the heating system. The current ceiling heaters are not very efficient and are very expensive to run.

There may well be other ideas and suggestions that will be considered, and the committee would like to invite residents to consider this and bring suggestions to the AGM (date TBC) or let us know by email.



The AGM will take place as soon as possible once we know more about social distancing rules and public gatherings. This AGM is critical for the village hall as two of the four committee members are not standing for re election.

The current committee is chaired by Pearl Ambrose, with members Graham Maskell, Stephen Lerner (takes all bookings) and Gordon Fraser (minute taker). Both Stephen and Gordon contribute much unseen work for the village hall and when they leave there will be a big gap in the committee and its ability to function.

If you have some spare time please can you come to the AGM; or send either Stephen or me an email if you think you would like to be part of the village hall committee. The more residents we can get to join the committee, the more successful we will be in maintaining and developing this fantastic resource.

As soon as we have secured a date for the AGM we will put up notices in the bus shelters and spread the word on the village Whatsapp group and in this magazine.

## **Coronavirus scam**

Suffolk Constabulary is reminding people to stay alert to criminals looking to continue to exploit the vulnerable during the coronavirus outbreak.

Whilst the vast majority of people volunteering are doing so for the right reasons, there are a small minority of people who see this difficult time as an opportunity to commit crime.

Therefore, officers are keen for people to be aware of the very simple steps they can take to protect themselves from handing over their money, or personal details, to criminals. Police are urging people to take a moment to think before parting with their money or information.

County Policing Commander for Suffolk Chief Superintendent Marina Ericson said: "Just take a few moments to think – has the approach come from a cold call, or unexpected text or email? Could it be fake? Do you know or trust the person it's come from?"

"It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you. Take your time to discuss what is being asked of you with friends or family.

"Remember, the police, or your bank, will never ask you to withdraw money or transfer it to a different account. They will never ask you to reveal your full banking password or PIN."

The majority of groups are well intentioned and will be working through the voluntary or charity sector and will be very happy to provide you with proof as to who they are. If you receive an unexpected text or email asking for personal or financial details do

not click on the links or attachments. Ensure you have the latest software and application updates installed on all your devices.

If you think you've been a victim of a scam, contact your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or via [actionfraud.police.uk](http://actionfraud.police.uk).

## **Advice**

- Only accept help from people you know and / or trust. Never deal with unexpected cold callers;
- You do not have to agree to anything with which you don't feel comfortable;
- Police, health workers and others will not, and do not, call at your house to test for coronavirus or ask for money regarding investigations;
- Check the person calling at your door has valid identification, even if they are dressed in uniform;
- Do not transfer any money across to someone who calls you over the phone: banks will not ask for your personal security details;
- Do not trust anyone asking for money transfers or cash over the phone;
- Do not make shopping purchases from a company or person you do not know and trust. Use a credit card to pay to protect yourselves.


