From the Rector

Killer Corgettes

I remember visiting my granny and grandpa each week when I was growing up, and I'm afraid to say that I used to switch off when the conversation invariably turned to the condition of their vegetables. They were from the generation that had to 'dig for Britain' during the war, and the habit of growing their own produce never left them, to their credit.

As I suspect many of us have discovered, we often end up adopting those habits which so irritated us about our parents and grandparents. Accordingly, this year, prompted by Covid, my wife and I decided it was time to start growing some vegetables for ourselves. I constructed some raised beds, and with help from a generous neighbour we got some topsoil, and the planting began.

On balance we've had a pretty good year. A notable success was our courgette plants which never stopped growing and seemed to be able to generate a marrow-sized courgette within a day if we were not picking them regularly.

There is simple pleasure, shared I am sure by many thousands across the country for the first time this year, in growing and eating our own food.

However, one prominent online newspaper drew attention to the fact that just occasionally courgettes can be toxic. In fact this story appeared twice. My sympathies of course go out to anyone who was unfortunately afflicted by these toxic courgettes, and it is helpful for us beginners to be aware of this risk.

At the same time it was both laughable and depressing that the way these articles were presented. They managed to take something as

natural and wholesome as growing a humble courgette, and present it with overtones of fear, death, and blame.

As we reflect on the way the news is presented to us at the moment, I am concerned that we are bombarded with overtones of fear, death, and blame far too often, when the truth is there is also so much that is good in the world to celebrate. So let's make sure we do!

Staying secure as clocks go back

With British Summer Time ending at 2am on Sunday 25 October, Suffolk Police are urging people to boost their home security as the nights get longer. Dark winter nights bring with them an increase in home break-ins.

Chief Inspector Stuart Grimsey said: "Leaving your house in complete darkness is a clear sign to burglars that it may be empty which, with the sun setting before most people get home from work during the winter, is an open invitation to opportunistic thieves.

"If no one is going to be home when darkness falls, consider leaving a light on or invest in a timer so that your lights or radio come on automatically at certain times to give the impression that someone is in. There are also systems that combine with smart phone apps, which allow you to operate electronic equipment in your home from anywhere in the world."

In addition to timers, Suffolk Police recommend investing in other forms of technology. Chief Inspector Grimsey said: "Consider installing alarm systems, CCTV as well as doorbell camera technology to secure your home further. There is real value in using technology such as cameras to help keep yourself and your community safe from crime, and they don't have to be expensive."

Suffolk Police are also reminding members of the public not to advertise their homes are empty on social media by 'checking in' to other places or publicising that they are on holiday.

If you notice any suspicious activity or believe a crime is in progress you are urged to call the police immediately on 999. If you feel that you have information about crimes being committed you can call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.




